# John 1:1-14 ESV

<sup>14</sup> And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. <sup>15</sup> (John bore witness about him, and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me.'") <sup>16</sup> For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. <sup>17</sup> For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup> No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.

# HIS GLORIOUS INCARNATION (v. 14)

God did not dwell in a man; God became Man. "*He became what He was not previously, though He never ceased to be all that He was before*" (A .W. Pink).

## HIS GLORIOUS PREEXISTENCE (v. 15)

In a culture of the "*older the higher*," John the Baptist proclaimed the deity of Jesus as existing before John.

## HIS GLORIOUS GRACE (vv. 16-17)

What wonderful grace we witness in Christ's coming to us as one of us. "Amazing grace! How sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see" (John Newton).

## **HIS GLORIOUS REVELATION** (v. 18)

Jesus Christ, the Word-made-flesh has exposed God to man. Jesus is the visible image of the invisible God.

"Abounding sin is the terror of the world, but abounding grace is the hope of mankind." – A. W. Tozer
